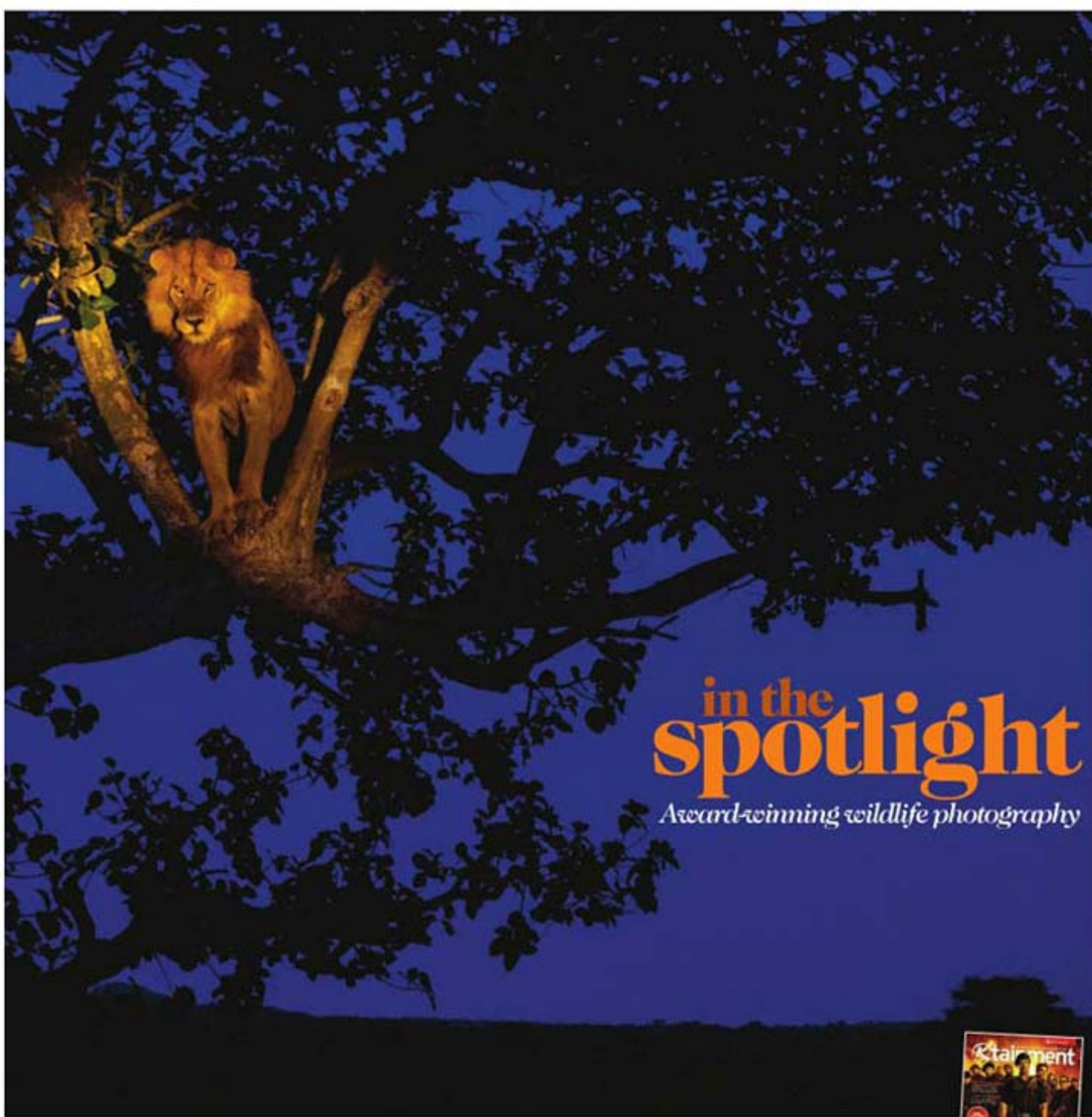


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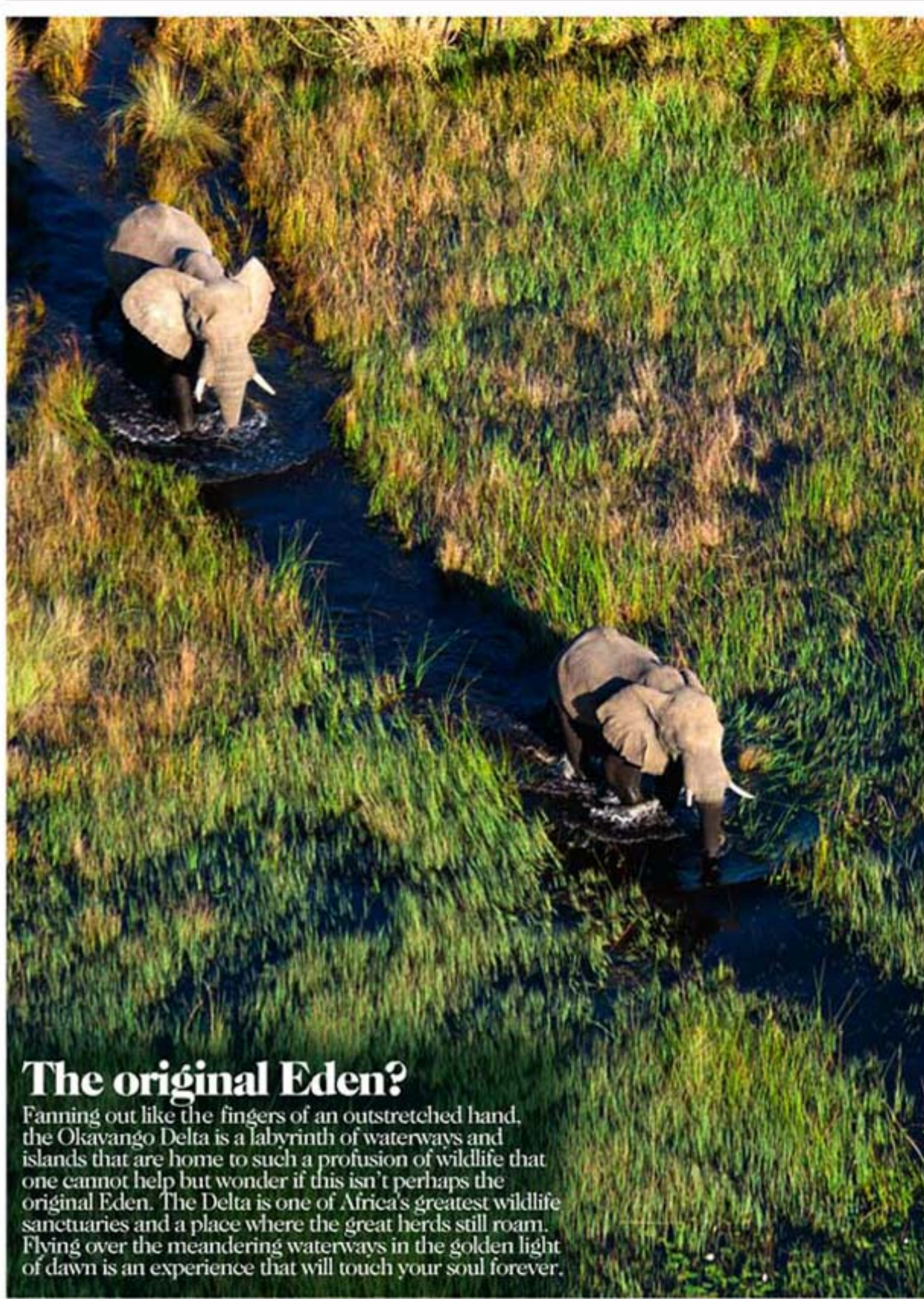

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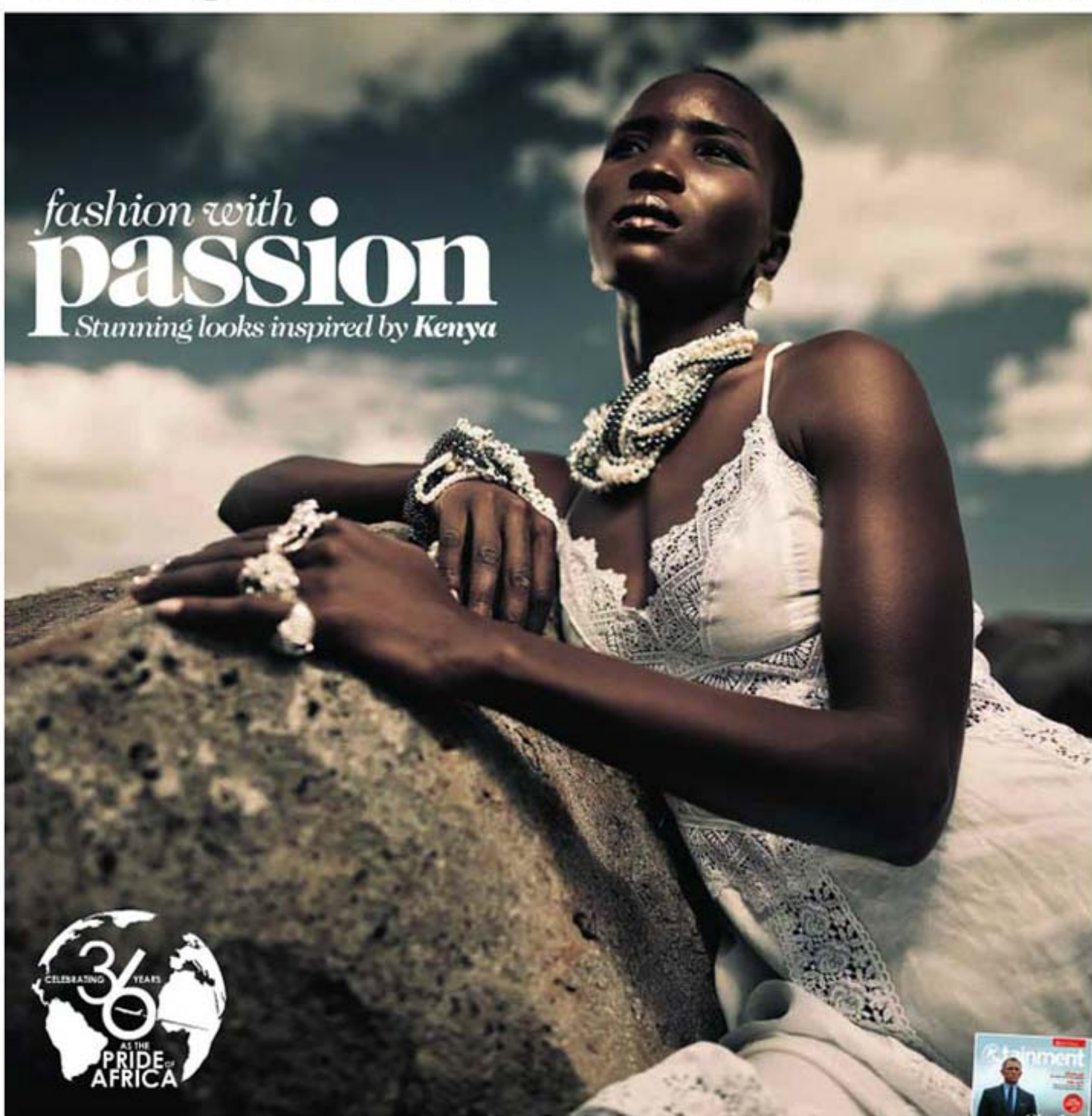
The original Eden?

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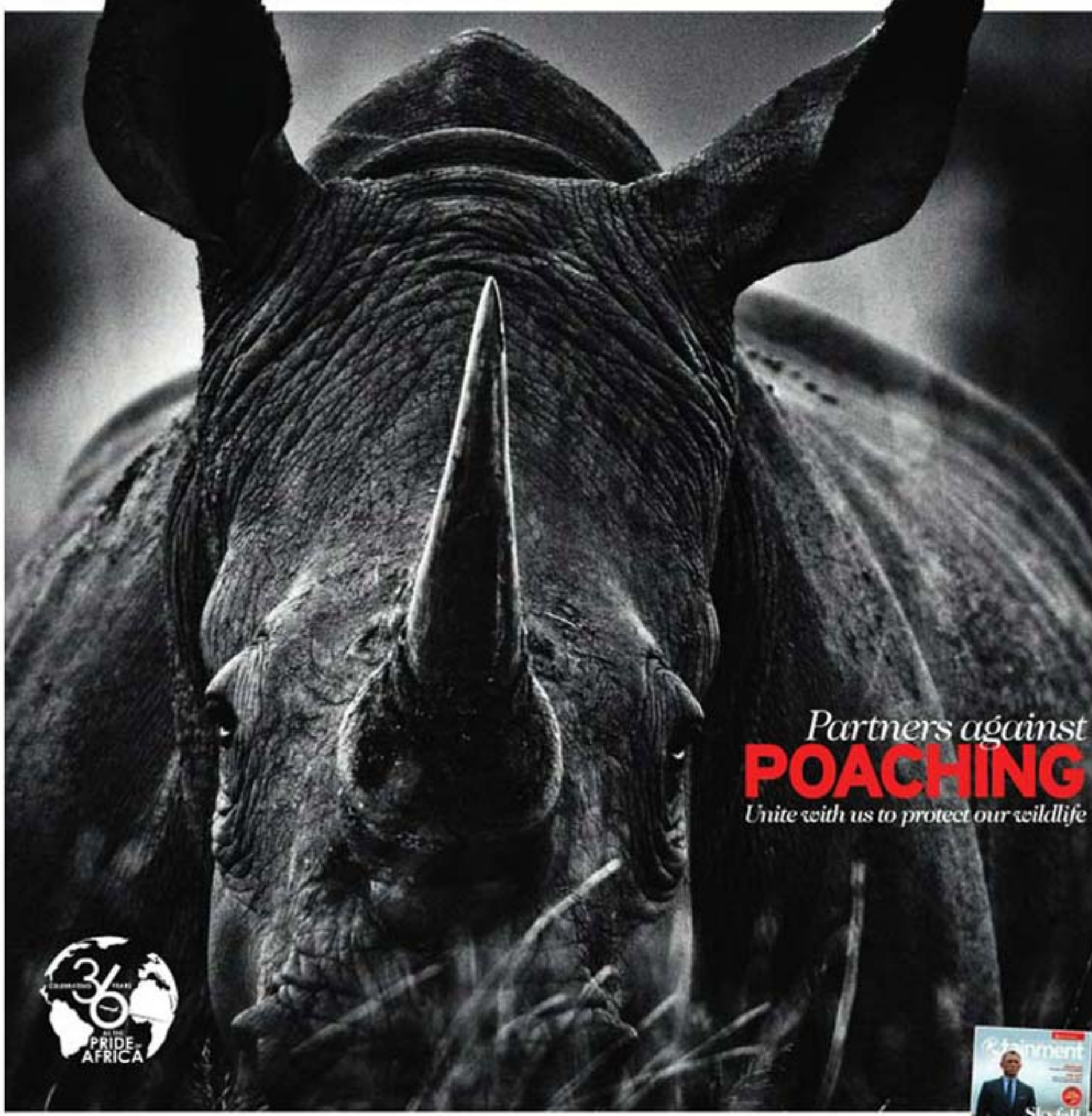
Mozambique's bounty

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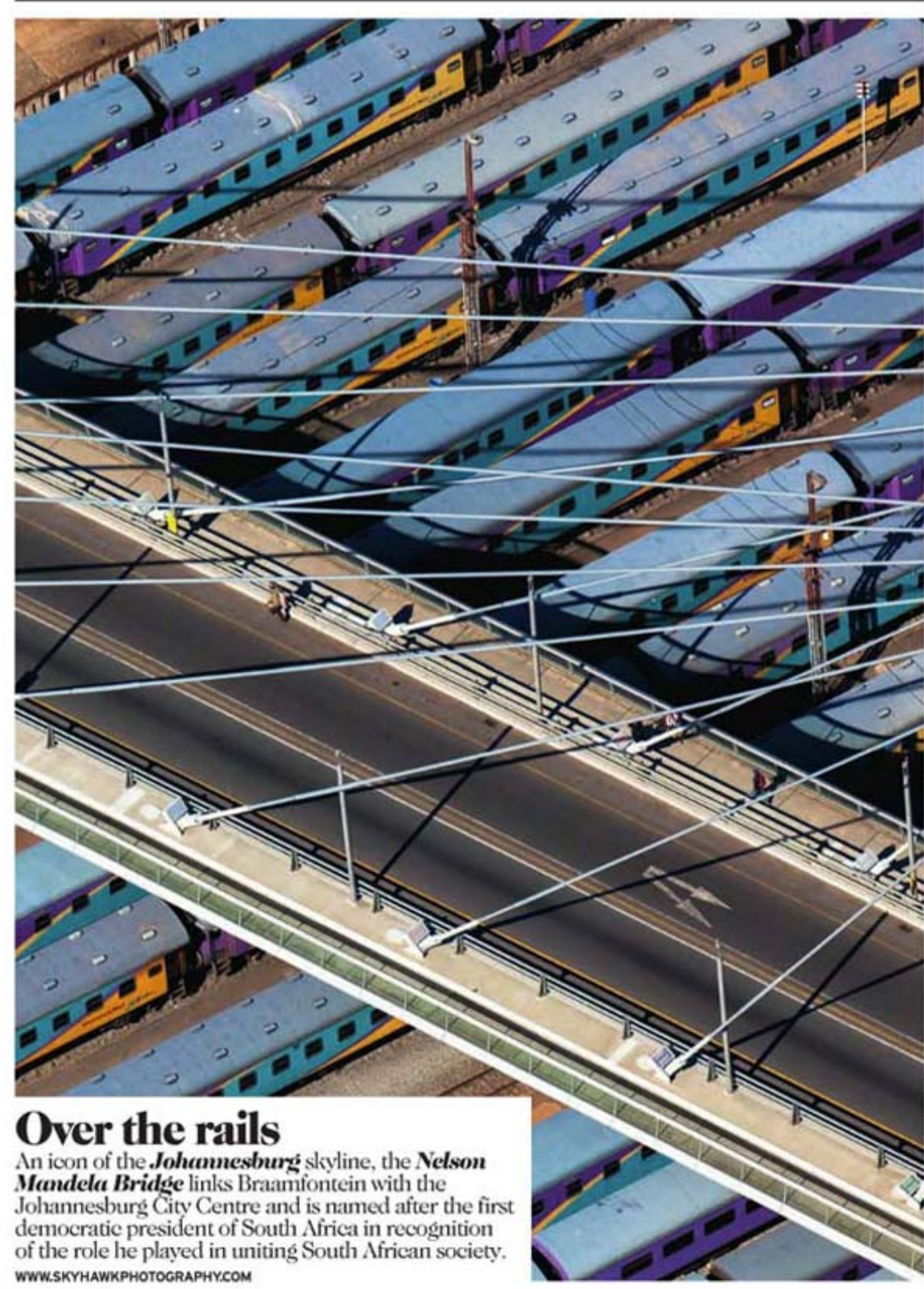

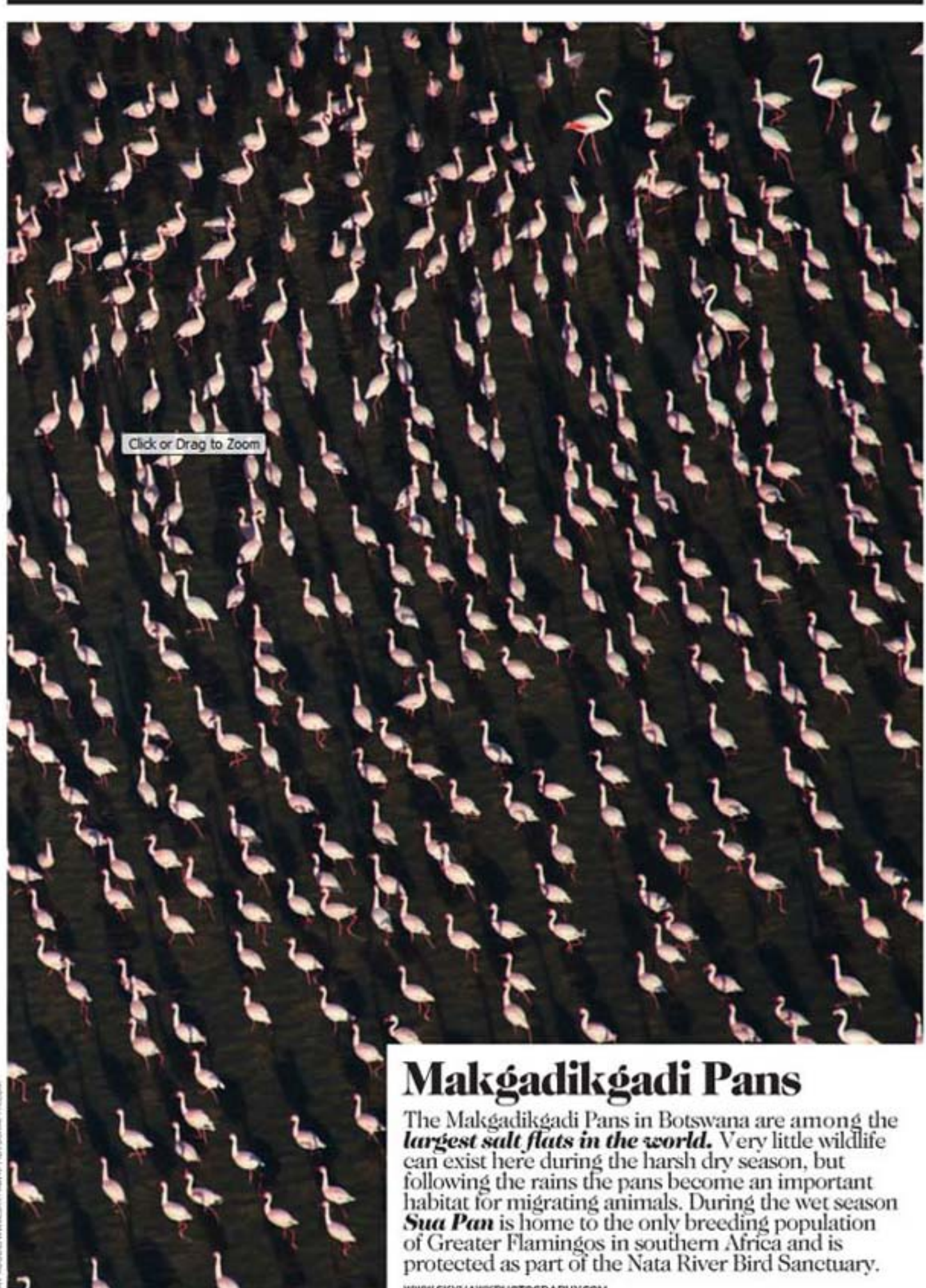

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Makgadikgadi Pans

The Makgadikgadi Pans in Botswana are among the largest salt flats in the world. Very little wildlife can exist here during the harsh dry season, but following the rains the pans become an important habitat for migrating animals. During the wet season Sua Pan is home to the only breeding population of Greater Flamingos in southern Africa and is protected as part of the Nata River Bird Sanctuary.
